## THE FINGER LAKES

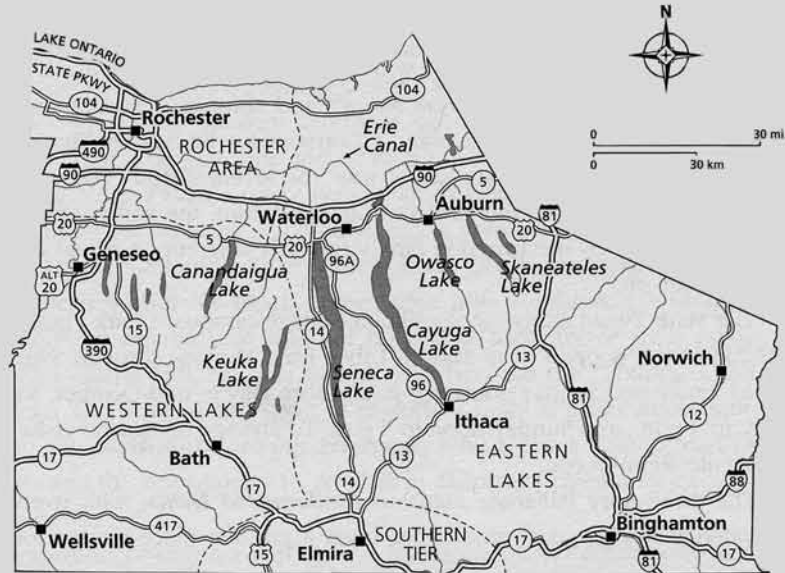


Between New York's "northern seaboard" along Lake Ontario and the Pennsylvania border lies the region that many visitors consider to be the most beautiful part of the state. South of the Lake Ontario plain, the Finger Lakes area appears to be furrowed on a vast scale, with hilly farmland descending toward each of the lakes only to rise again before the next. The aptly named elongated lakes extend roughly north and south across an 80-mile swath of the state, offering vistas reminiscent of parts of Switzerland. It's no wonder the city at the northern end of Seneca Lake was named Geneva.

Another distinctly European aspect of the Finger Lakes area is its status as New York State's premier wine-growing region. No longer limited to just the cultivation of native grape varieties, New York's vintners have come a long way. Visits to individual vineyards and the wine museum described in this section will demonstrate their vast history and achievements.

Scenes of well-tended vines in rows along steep hillsides may be reminiscent of Europe, but the Finger Lakes region is rich in Americana with museums of coverlets, Victorian dolls, and horse-drawn carriages. You'll even find Mark Twain's study and a museum devoted to Memorial Day.

#### 100 Off the Beaten Path

There's hardly anyplace more off-the-beaten-path than **Dr. Konstantin Frank Vinifera Wine Cellars**, on the western banks of Keuka Lake. Yet oenophiles still wind their way through the vineyards to reach the tasting room, eager to sip Pinot Noirs, Gewürztraminers, sparkling wines, and Rieslings. Dr. Frank's wines have won dozens of gold medals and have been ranked among the country's best wines by tastemakers like *Wine Spectator* magazine, finally bringing New York vintages into the national spotlight.

Back in the 1950s, when Dr. Frank arrived from Europe speaking not a word of English, vintners in the Finger Lakes were using indigenous American grapes to make wine that was pretty harsh and unsophisticated. A doctor of viticulture in his native Ukraine, Dr. Frank believed that the *Vitis Vinifera*, the wine grapes of Europe, could be cultivated here, even with the cold winters. He proved it by grafting the varietal vines onto hardy rootstock, and today we can savor the fruits of his labor.
