Winery Background

Dr. Konstantin Frank ignited the “Vinifera Revolution”, a movement that forever changed the course of wine growing in the Finger Lakes and the United States. Dr. Frank’s vision, knowledge and determination are credited with elevating the New York wine industry from a state of happy mediocrity to a level that today commands world attention. Located on Keuka lake in the Finger Lakes region, Dr. Konstantin Frank Wines features some of the oldest vinifera vines in the United States and continues to produce wines of distinction and quality.

Vinification

The grapes were hand-picked and gently whole cluster pressed to extract the flavors without color. The 2nd fermentation took place in bottle as per the traditional Méthode Champenoise. The wine was left in bottle in contact with the lees for 4 years before disgorgement.

The Wine

Description: Medium intensity with crisp acidity followed by notes of pomegranate, granny smith apple, buttery pastries, nutmeg and almond.

Style:	Dry with textural mouth feel.
Body:	Medium bodied
Vintage Influence:	A softer, less mineral, more textural wine compared to other vintages.
Cellaring:	Drink now or cellar until 2020
Food Pairing:	Fondue, smoked salmon, prosciutto wrapped scallops
Analysis:	Alcohol: 12.3%, Acidity: 0.10 g/100mL, pH: 3:10, Sugar: 1%
